With the exception of July, when we again join forces with the **Friends of Jazz** at the **Danville Grange**, and the as yet unannounced event in December, we will continue to meet at **Champa Restaurant** in El Sobrante (technically, San Pablo), where the owners extend their hospitality free of charge, a fact that is saving the club more than \$1,000 per year.

As an organization, we have several goals in the coming year, chief among them the "education, preservation and promotion of Traditional Jazz," as it says in our mission statement. Close behind that, however, will be to promote the club itself, in an attempt to raise our profile, as well as draw new members who will sustain the education, preservation and promotion of Traditional Jazz for future generations. The **NOJCNC Board** is considering adding a volunteer position for overseeing the marketing of the club, a job that in this day and age is far beyond necessary. As always, we welcome your input, as well as your volunteer efforts.

Considering the struggles behind-the-scenes, we had an outstanding turnout at our 2011 opener meeting with the always popular Natural Gas Jazz Band. The Gas (with club co-president Tom Belmessieri filling in for Phil Crumley), whisked through three sets of favorites and surprises, ranging from "Buddy's Habits" to "If I Had My Way" to "Chelsea on Down," as well as a rollicking version of Waller's "Minor Drag" (which it turns out is neither). Special thanks to all the jammers who filled the stage for three sets, including: Jim Broadstreet, Dana Kemp, Carol Dutcher, Alex Newman, Rod Roberts, Bruce Stangeland, Mike Somers, Ken Peterson, Ted Shafer and Earl Sheelar.
